After parent conferences and the Thanksgiving break, Oasis social studies are sponsoring a trip to the International Festival in Essex Junction. This will be a cultural exploration where our travelers will have their "Passports" stamped from different countries they visit. They will experience music, dance and cultural performances from around the world as well as have an opportunity to taste the flavors from many places. As the holiday season continues Oasis social studies students will explore our own cultural backgrounds and bring in a dish from an ancestral country to share with the class. We closed out the week prior to Thanksgiving break with some fun holiday projects. 
personal story about David's first guitar, lovingly crafted by his uncle. Many thanks to Synergy parent drivers who made this trip possible! We could not have attended without your support.

Here is some news from the classroom:




In ELA, Synergies continue to expand their Tier 2 academic vocabulary with words they will encounter across multiple subject areas. Most recently, we have been focusing on Latin and Greek word roots.





We are working on understanding how to effectively use text evidence to support a claim. This is an important

skill when writing proof paragraphs and essays. Evidence can be quoted directly or paraphrased, and the source must always be cited. Synergies practiced paraphrasing quotes from such diverse sources as Dr. Seuss and Maya Angelou to Japanese proverbs. A few students went on to write their own quotes about life for peers to paraphrase!



In social studies, we concluded our mapping unit with a close looks on different map projections. Students modeled the distortion of a polar projection by marking the

top of a 2-liter bottle with latitude and longitude lines to represent the northern hemisphere. By shining a light onto the "hemisphere" and observing the shadows cast by the lines, we could see how images get increasingly distorted as you move away from the center point.

We also made functioning latitude finders using nothing more complicated than a cardboard triangle, a protractor, and some string. Synergies practiced using their latitude finders in the classroom by sitting off several "North Stars" positioned at different angles in the classroom.



We have now shifted our focus to examining culture: How and why are groups of

people culturally similar and different? Why is it necessary to understand culture when studying a global problem and potential solutions? How has globalization influenced cultural diversity? Synergies have been examining photographs representing artifacts from a mystery culture. They have noted details and used these to make inferences about the culture - what the geography of their land is like, what they appear to value, how they might make a living, and so on.

## **GALAXY TEAM**

Galaxy students have been very productive during the months of October and November! We continue to enjoy the team's high energy and creativity, while balancing fun and hard work. Thank you to all the parents and guardians who have signed up during conference days. We will continue to meet regularly with any parent/guardian who would like a conference.

Here's what is happening on team:

Language Arts: Students have wrapped up a unit on Elements of Literature and we are now reading The Revealers by Vermont author, Doug Wilhelm. The level of discussion and writing around the many important topics such as bullying, family, and middle school friendships has been interesting. Galaxy students have also been practicing paragraph writing, journaling, and expanding academic vocabulary. All sixth grade Language teachers are piloting a new vocabulary program this year. We will be meeting throughout the year to share ideas and evaluate student progress.

Math: Students continue to work on skills through weekly IXL practice and ST Math.

Galaxy students are finishing up work on Geometry and will be heading into the study of ratios.

**Science:** Students are currently working on a long term ecology project using Book Creator. Ask your child to see all the good research they have done so far.

**Social Studies**: Map skills review has ended, but skills will be applied throughout the year. After completing a review and slide presentation on land and water features around the world, students applied their knowledge of land and water features to their unique island designs!

Students are currently writing and recording scripts to entice visitors to visit their islands. The next focus will be on the physical geography of North America, with a special focus on Canada. Canada is our next big unit which will take us to the end of January.

Special thanks to students who have participated in our social committee meetings.

Congratulations to all our students who have made the honor roll for the first quarter. We also want to acknowledge the many students who have made great progress since September.

#### SOLSTICE TEAM

#### Science:

Solstice scientists recently investigated how thermal energy is transported through convection currents, and how those currents are driven by changes in density and buoyancy. Next, we will explore how energy from solar radiation drives convection currents that move air, ocean water, and thermal energy around Earth, causing regional and local climate and weather patterns. Follow our class on Twitter @SolsticeScience.

#### Math:

Our seventh graders have finished a unit on working with positive and negative numbers and applied that work to solving algebraic equations. We are now beginning a unit on proportional reasoning, which will involve solving proportions, unit rate, discount, tax, tip, and scale drawings.

Our eighth graders continue to investigate the various components and characteristics of linear relationships. We have looked at solving multi-step equations and their connection to two-variable linear relationships, and are now graphing linear equations and discussing slope, intercepts, different forms of linear equations (slope-intercept, point-slope, and standard), as well as the characteristics or parallel and perpendicular lines.

Some of our eighth graders are also taking the Algebra Seminar as a supplement to the eighth-grade curriculum, with the goal of taking Geometry next year in high school. They have completed a unit on statistics, and are now investigating what the shape of a graph tells you about the relationship between the variables.

## **Language Arts:**

The end of November, students finished up writing paragraphs about the eerie short stories we read. Students used evidence and analysis to explain their thinking.

We looked at discussed picture books in order to understand the Civil Rights Era and prepare us for reading Brown Girl Dreaming by Jaqueline Woodson.

While reading *Brown Girl Dreaming* we are discussing our sense of place in the world and how places in our lives define us. We read and discuss almost daily and will be completing other activities throughout the unit, including writing our own poetry and analyzing the main character.

Students continue to turn in reading logs every two weeks, generally on Thursdays. Some students have the opportunity to complete a project instead of reading logs. This is for 8th graders who continually turned in reading logs on time during first quarter and usually met their page goal.

# **Indigo Team**

We have been very engaged on the Indigo Team since our last newsletter! Here are a few details!



about their their trips.

\*Social Studies: Our team is just finishing up a "trip" through the regions of Canada. Working solo, in pairs, or in groups of three, kids are learning about Canada by pretending to take a trip to each of Canada's six regions. They are reading to find out background information, then using map and online resources to explore the different parts of Canada through a tourist's lens. IPads have added a fun dimension to this project, allowing kids to use apps like Pic Collage and Book Creator, as well as photo editing apps, to create create wonderful, fun, "meaty," and very individual projects

\*Language Arts: Recently, our team has become part of a district vocabulary pilot, where students are creatively learning and practicing a set of high-impact words, expected to help them across curricular areas. The sign language piece of the process is particularly fun and helpful for many kids. Ask your child to show you the sign for "evidence" or "inference!" Simultaneously, we have been reading and discussing the sixth grade

anchor book, <u>The Revealers</u>, including lots of literary analysis and discussions, and work on LEAF paragraphs, a sixth grade writing focus. We anticipate that these conversations will continue well beyond the conclusion of The Revealers and will help inform the way we talk with each other all year.

\*Science: Ecology studies continue! Our trip to Ethan Allen forest, as well as on-campus outdoor work, have added a "place-based" component to our learning, as well as being lots of fun! Students have been working to apply vocabulary and concepts that they have learned through the hands-on explorations in our own deciduous biome, to biomes throughout the world. Students are researching and writing postcards about different biomes in locations of their choice. IPads are once again allowing us to mix things up a bit, with several tech-based mini-projects available to take the place of traditional postcards in more than one biome.



\*Math: Our team has concluded our first Common Core unit on rational numbers. We are pleased with the progress kids made with this challenging topic. The rational number work leads us naturally into fraction and decimal operations. Our focus is on division, but we will also be checking in to make sure that kids recall the processes and concepts of adding, subtracting and multiplying fractions, decimals, and whole numbers. We will be using classroom volunteers and peer tutors to offer coaching and challenge opportunities as we strive to get everyone ready for mastering division in all kinds of contexts, with all kinds of numbers. Simultaneously, we continue to tackle complex, engaging, real-life problem-solving on a regular basis. Indigo kids are definitely growing in their ability to persevere

through tough challenges!


