Clear the Halls/Secure the Building Actions

We've had to use these actions several times in the first month of school. These actions can be anxiety provoking so I want to explain what they are and when they are used. These actions are used for lower level disturbances in the school. They are not for serious threats. We use these actions for medical issues where we want to make sure the privacy of the individual is preserved and to allow support for the individual without bystanders. We also use these actions when a student or students are struggling with their behavior in the hallway (Hold/Clear the Halls) or outside the building (Secure). These actions are called to reduce student contact, keep the student(s) involved safe and others safe until the responding staff can get the student or students calm and in a safe place. These are not drills we would use for a serious threat. In a Hold/Clear the Halls, classroom doors are locked and it's business as usual in the classroom. In a Secure, students and staff come inside the building, outside doors are locked, and it is business as usual in the building. Students and staff are free to move about the building. The most common reason for a Secure the building is a student who is struggling with their behavior and has gone outside. A **Secure** is used to make sure responding staff can calm the student before they return to the building or go home, depending on the situation.

Options Based Safety Drills

Hunt Middle School in coordination with Burlington School District, the Vermont School



Safety Center and under the guidance of the Vermont Agency of Education will be conducting school safety drills throughout the 2022-2023 school year. Our School Safety Drill Guidance is a collaboration between the Agency of Education and the Division of Fire Service that details the evacuation drill and options based response to an active shooter drill requirements.

According to the National Child Traumatic Stress Network (NCTSN) Guidance for "Creating School Active Shooter/Intruder Drills", "Safety drills need to incorporate a lockdown response but also an "option-based" approach. An option-based approach means that there are different actions educators and students can take if confronted by an active shooter/intruder (e.g., run away, keep out, and hide)." According to the NCTSN, the developmental level of our middle school students may allow some students to be ready to actively participate and make decisions when faced with an options-based approach. The purpose of the drills is to allow our students to practice various responses.

We will follow state guidance and announce all "Options-Based Response to Violent Intruder" drills immediately prior to the drill being conducted. This will limit the anxiety associated with these drills and ensure these drills are conducted in a safe and effective manner. For school evacuation drills, we will announce on the day of the scheduled drill, but unlike the "options- based drills" these do not require an announcement immediately prior to the physical activation of the alarm.

We will be pre teaching expectations for both drills in advisory. There will be time for questions and exploration in advisory also. All students will be encouraged to share anxieties at this time and/or to seek support from our Assistant Principal, Mrs. Gould or a school counselor.

Please feel free to discuss these drills with your student to best support them during this time. We are required to perform both an evacuation drills and an options-based drills throughout the year. World Language/French has Begun


